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INVITATION TO TENDER FOR STANDING TIMBER

Camquhart, Cowal

REFERENCE: Camquhart 2024-1

Description: A standing sale containing good quality Sitka spruce with areas of Douglas fir and

Japanese larch which is subject to SPHN (Ref: STH22_0175-0178 Camquhart). Terrain across the site is generally steep but with careful planning it is anticipated to be suitable for mechanised harvesting. Sections of the sale area may require winch

work and additional manual felling.

Timing: Tenders should be received by 12 noon on Tuesday 23 April 2024, by email to

tenders@greshamhouse.com.

Offers: The contract will be based on a single price per tonne. Please state your planned

start and completion date for the harvesting.

Location: Camquhart forest is located on the western side of Glendaruel on the Cowal

Peninsula. The forest entrance is located to the north of Clachan of Glendaruel and to the west of the A886, at the entrance signposted "Glendaruel Caravan Park". From this location access is by crossing the timber bridge and taking the immediate left onto

the designated STTS haul route.

Volumes: The tonnage has been estimated by the woodland manager.

Access, Extraction and Stacking:

Stacking areas and forwarding methodology must be agreed with the woodland manager. Additional benches required to facilitate suitable timber stacking to reduce forwarding activity on the road will be at the cost of the purchaser.

Timber haulage from the forest will be over the Glendaruel timber haul route which joins onto the A886 and crosses but does not run on the severely restricted UC22. Timing and capacity restrictions apply to haulage of timber over the timber haul route.

Hazards:

Hazards are detailed on the attached plan. All environmental mitigation works are the responsibility of the timber purchaser. As detailed on the plan there is a private water supply and two weir tanks within the sale area. Extreme caution is to be applied to ensure the water quality is maintained and there is no silt or contamination to the supply. A water management plan is to be prepared in advance of harvesting detailing the felling and extraction regime to prevent impact on both the water quality and infrastructure.

The other primary hazards are the steep working slopes and water management across the site due to multiple watercourses bisecting the sale area and leading to the River Ruel and Ruel Estuary which has a SSSI designation. There will be connecting drains within the coupes which will have to be managed appropriately.

Felling adjacent to boundary fences is to be completed sensitively and without damage.

Forest Plan Ref:

Permission to fell will be via a consented forest plan with reference 16FGS06255.

Reporting:

The purchaser is required to report monthly to GHAM and a copy of the report template is available on request. The report will require the date, delivery number and tonnes of each load in a spreadsheet format. GHAM will expect to be able to obtain copies of all weight tickets at any point during the contract.

Felling:

All conifers in the sale area should be felled unless instructed by the Woodland Manager. All material above 5cm diameter is to be removed from the site by the purchaser.

Brash:

Brash is to be kept clear of all watercourses during the felling operations. Purchasers should state their proposals for leaving the site clear and ready for replanting following discussion with the Woodland Manager and brash should be cut into lengths of less than 2 metres.

Payment:

Payment terms are to be on a monthly basis with the purchaser producing self billing invoices based on weight tickets, or as otherwise agreed between the parties. A down payment may be payable before entry and offset against the penultimate payment, or as otherwise agreed between the parties.

Contract:

An Agreement will be required to be signed by both parties. A copy is available on request.

Although the vendor intends to sell the timber, the vendor will not be bound to accept the highest or any other offer.

Viewing:

The timber may be viewed at any reasonable time during daylight hours, as long as a copy of this document is carried.
